## GUINNESS BEER BREAD

1 LARGE CAN GUINNESS STOUT 13.9 OZ. <sup>Room</sup> TEMPERATURE

1/4 CUP WATER

SIFT THE DRY INGREDIENTS TOGETHER IN A LARGE BOWL. IN THE LACK OF A SIFTER,

JUST COVER THE BOWL SECURELY AND SHAKE WELL

ADD THE BEER (MUST BE AT ROOM TEMPERATURE)

JUST POUR THE BEER IN DON'T TRY TO KEEP THE HAND DOWN. ADD WATER, MIX WELL.

POUR THE LOUGH BATTER INTO A GREASED BREAD PAN. COVER WITH CLOTH TOWEL, PLACE IN WARM DRAFT FREE PLACE AND LET RISE ABOUT 45 MINUTES. BAKE AT 425° FOR

30 MINS. SERVE WARM
